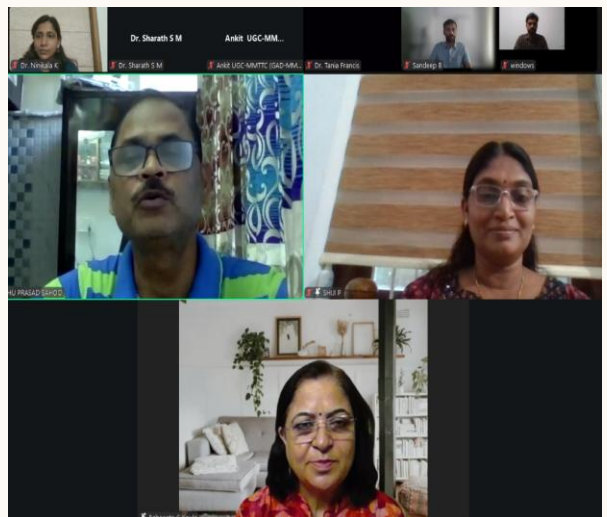
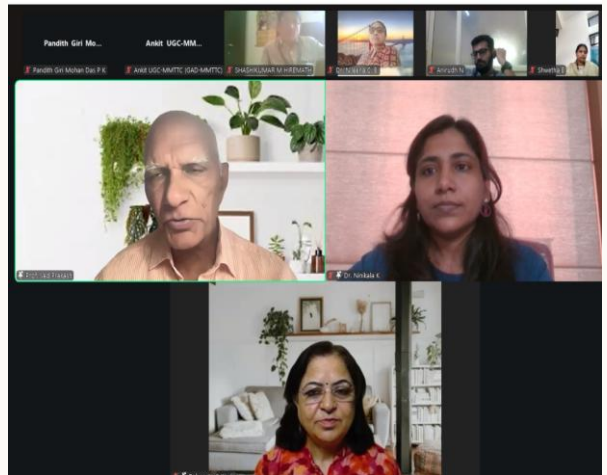

# ONE DAY SEMINAR ON “THE NEW INCOME TAX ACT, 2025: AN OVERVIEW OF THE KEY CHANGES”

The Department of Commerce, Providence Women’s College (Autonomous) organised a One Day Seminar on “The New Income Tax Act, 2025: An Overview of the Key Changes” on 26 March 2026. The programme was conducted in association with the Direct Taxes Committee (DTC) of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and supported by the Income Tax Department, Directorate of Income Tax (PR, PP & P).

The seminar aimed to provide participants with an understanding of the major reforms introduced under the New Income Tax Act, 2025, which focuses on simplification, transparency, and improved compliance in the taxation system. The sessions offered a comparative overview of important provisions and highlighted their implications for taxpayers and professionals.

The technical sessions were handled by **Smitha V, Chartered Accountant**, and **Santhosh Pai, Chartered Accountant**, who discussed key aspects of the new Act, including residential status of assesseees, heads of income, set-off and carry forward of losses, deduction provisions, taxation of charitable trusts, and assessment procedures.

The summit aimed to inspire and empower women by providing a platform for interaction with successful professionals from diverse fields.

The event featured inspiring sessions by eminent personalities including Archana Anand, Former Chief Business Officer of ZEE5 Global, Vinodini Sukumar, Managing Director of Team One Advertising Pvt. Ltd. and President of the Cochin Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and noted actress Maala Parvathi. The speakers shared their professional journeys and experiences, highlighting the importance of leadership, resilience, and innovation in building successful careers.



As part of the institution's efforts to promote financial awareness and responsible money management among students, two **Financial Literacy Programs** were organised during the academic year **2025–26**.

The **Level 1 Financial Literacy Program** was conducted on **11 September 2025** on the topic "*Fundamentals of Financial Planning, Capital Market, and Responsible Investing.*" The session was handled by **Nikhil P. N.**, a trainer from the **National Institute of Securities Markets**. The programme focused on the basics of financial planning, budgeting, saving, and an introduction to the capital market and investment instruments.

The **Level 2 Financial Literacy Program** was held on **19 and 20 September 2025** on the topic "*Investing in Your Future: Financial Literacy and Capital Market.*" The session was led by **Sanesh Cholakkad**, a trainer associated with **\*\*Securities and Exchange Board of India SMARTS** initiative. The programme provided deeper insights into investment avenues, regulatory frameworks, and the role of financial market institutions, helping students understand the functioning of the Indian financial system and the importance of informed investing.

Students participated in the **SEBI Investor Awareness Test** conducted by the **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** in association with the **National Institute of Securities Markets (NISM)** on **14 March 2026**. The test aimed to enhance students' understanding of the securities market and promote responsible and informed investing practices.

## ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CLUB

The Entrepreneurship Development Club of the college organized a series of activities during the reporting period with the objective of promoting entrepreneurial awareness, innovation, and consumer education among students.

As part of the observation of International MSME Day, the Entrepreneurship Development Club organized on 27th June 2025. The programme was conducted in collaboration with the Department of Industries and Commerce, District Industries Centre (DIC), Kozhikode, and the Taluk Industries Office, Kozhikode. The initiative aimed to familiarize students with the significance of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in economic development and to provide exposure to real-world entrepreneurial practices.

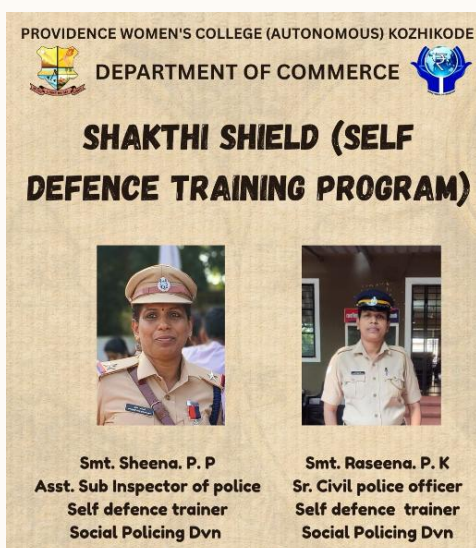

# CPBFI PROGRAMME & INDUSTRY COLLABORATION

The Department of Commerce conducted a 4-credit Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance and Insurance (CPBFI) in collaboration with Bajaj Finserv and Bajaj Finance Limited, following the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). The programme was designed to enhance students' industry readiness through structured and skill-oriented training.

The course was delivered in a hybrid mode, combining both online and offline sessions.

Course 4: Overview of Insurance

In addition to these modules, students underwent skill assessment sessions and participated in HR workshops aimed at improving employability skills. A mock interview session was also conducted by corporate recruiters, providing students with real-time interview experience and professional exposure.

Certificates were awarded to students upon successful completion of the course, along with HR Workshop Certificates based on their performance.

## ALUMNAE CONNECT PROGRAMMES

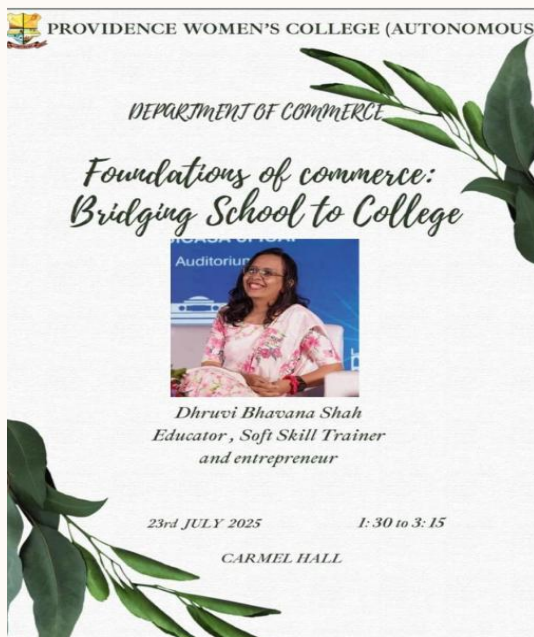

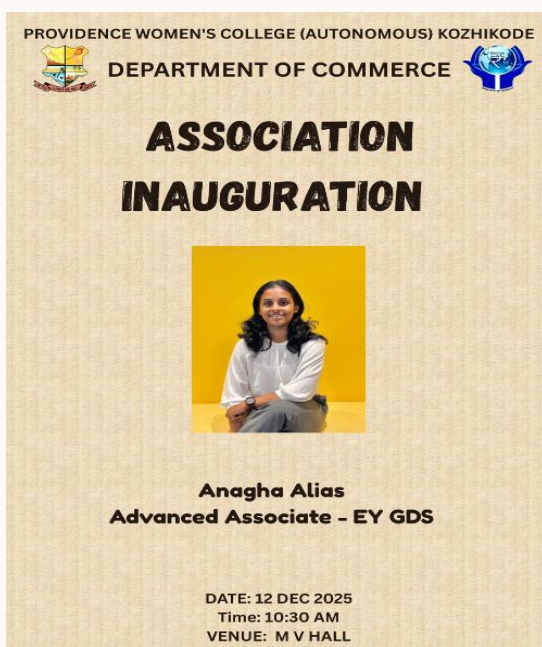

The **Association Inauguration** was held on **12th December**, marking the formal commencement of departmental academic and co-curricular activities for the year.

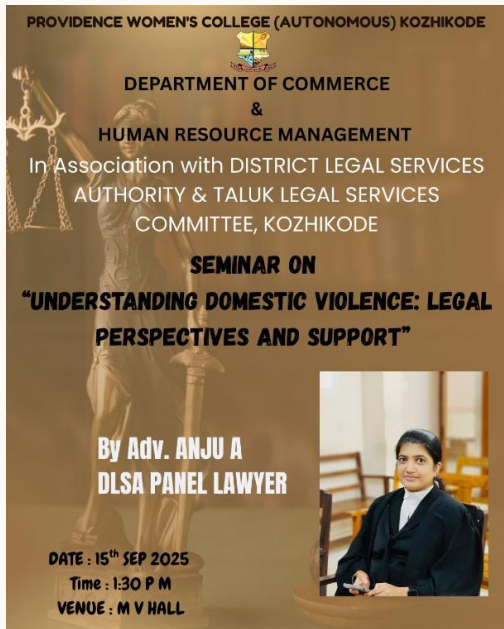

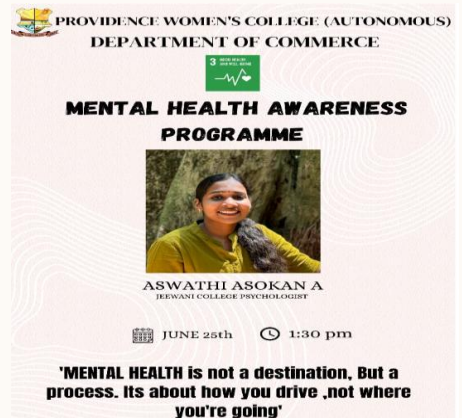

## Extension and Community Outreach Activities

The Department of Commerce, Providence Women's College (Autonomous) actively engaged in several extension and community outreach initiatives during the academic year, reflecting its commitment to social responsibility and sustainable development.

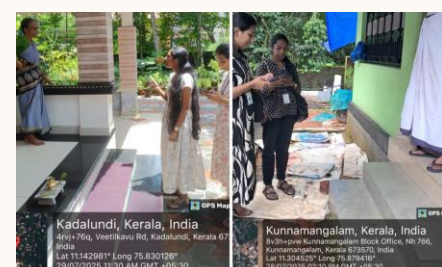
A research-based extension project titled “Household Waste Management for a Sustainable Tomorrow: An Evaluative Study” was undertaken under the Providence Research Scheme. The study covered Kuruvattoor, Chelannur, Kakkodi, Kunnamangalam, and Kadalundi Panchayats, addressing SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities) and SDG 13 (Climate Action), with the participation of 20 students.

To promote financial awareness, a Financial Literacy Awareness Campaign was conducted in selected areas of Kozhikode district, focusing on digital banking, safe online transactions, and responsible financial practices. The initiative supported SDG 4 (Quality Education) and SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) and involved 10 students.

The Department also organised a Book Donation Drive at Gender Park, Vellimadukunnu, encouraging learning and awareness while supporting SDG 4 (Quality Education) and SDG 5 (Gender Equality). Fifteen students participated in this initiative.

As part of its social outreach activities, the department extended support to Free Birds Children's Home by donating ₹3,500 for educational assistance to 18 children and distributing new dresses to 10 children during the Onam celebrations, bringing joy and encouragement to the residents.

Additionally, four students participated in a Three-Day Internship Programme on “Village-Level Employment Data Collection and Geo-Mapping”, certified by UBA-RCI, IIT Palakkad, with training support from the National Statistics Office (Field Operations Division), Kozhikode.

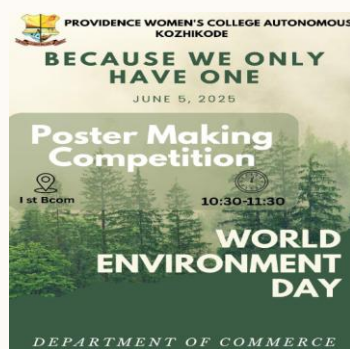
